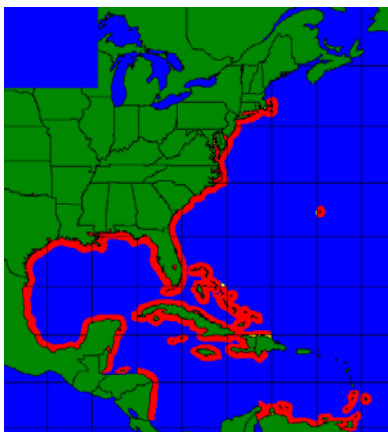

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## SAMPLE DAILY TROPICAL GUARDIAN DISPATCHES SENT VIA EMAIL

**TO: FLEETWEATHER TROPICAL GUARDIAN SUBSCRIBER - 31.05.2008 11:35GMT**

Synopsis: Broad tropical low pressure, associated with the remnants of pacific tropical storm Alma, is along the east coast of belize. Low-level circulation is a bit ill-defined, and majority of associated convection appears to be east of the main center. This system has the possibility of becoming the first tropical depression of the atlantic season. Otherwise, remainder of atlantic basin tropics, including the gulf of mexico and east central caribbean sea, are quiet.

**TO: FLEETWEATHER TROPICAL GUARDIAN SUBSCRIBER - 01.06.2008 10:56GMT**

Synopsis: Tropical storm Arthur is currently centered inland over the southern yucatan channel. Convection near the center is limited, with most of the associated convection to the east of the center. Given the strength of high pressure ridging to the north of Arthur, it is likely that this system will continue its westward drift across mexico, and will likely weaken into a tropical depression over the next 06-12hrs. Thereafter, it is expected to continue weakening into a remnant low over the next 48-72 hours.

Otherwise, the Gulf of Mexico, remainder of the Caribbean Sea, and the tropical Atlantic are fairly quiet.

Good day. Remnant low of former tropical storm Arthur remains inland over the central Yucatan peninsula. This low is still producing widespread squalls over the southwestern Caribbean. While tropical re-development is not expected, widespread squalls will persist across this region next few days.

Weak tropical wave located approximately 400nm southeast of Trinidad and Tobago is very disorganized and upper level conditions are not favorable for development as it moves w-wnw'ward next few days.
